### **UPDATE: COVID – 19 RESPONSE**

Towards the end of last term, COVID had a substantial impact on the preschool. Due to a staff shortage, the committee took the decision to close the preschool for the last two days of term. ### LEARNING THROUGH PLAY

Play is one of the most important ways in which young children gain essential knowledge and skills.

**Play is meaningful:** Children play to make sense of the world around them, and to find meaning in an experience by connecting it to something already known. Through play, children express and expand their understanding of their experiences.

**Play is joyful:** Look at children – or adults – playing, often smiling and laughing. Of course, play may have its frustrations and challenges (Who gets the first turn? Why can't I make this block building stay up?), but the overall feeling is one of enjoyment, motivation, thrill and pleasure.

**Play is actively engaging:** Watch children playing, and you will usually see that they become deeply involved, often combining physical, mental and verbal engagement.

**Play is interactive:** Play and learning are not static. Children play to practice skills, try out possibilities, revise hypotheses and discover new challenges, leading to deeper learning.

**Play is socially interactive**: Play allows children to communicate ideas, to understand others through social interaction, paving the way to build deeper understanding and more powerful relationships.

### **LENDING LIBRARY COMING SOON!**

In preschool we aim to spark a love of reading in children, and we need your help!

We are re-introducing the lending library and making it accessible to parent carers to borrow a book to read at home with their child(ren), to extend their learning beyond the preschool environment.

The lending library offers a variety of books ranging from fiction to non-fiction stories, and a selection of activities and games, which the children enjoy. Both the books and activities will:

- Promote familiar relationships with adults who are reading the story to the child
- Build confidence and self-esteem
- Aid cognitive development
- Support the development of communication and language
- Support good mental health and well-being
- Support and builds foundations of good literacy and reading skills, preparing the way for school
- Support the development of fine motor skills
- Support the development of listening and concentration skills

Twice a week you and your child(ren) will have a chance to choose a book to take home. This experience will be like visiting a library. Your child will choose a book, game, or activity that they enjoy, and we will lend them this book/game/activity to continue enjoying at home with their families.

The chosen book will be on loan to your child for one week only and must be returned the following week.

Working together we can spark that love for reading....Dr Seuss said "The more that you read, the more things you will know. The more that you learn, the more places you'll go".

### **CHILDCARE FEE INCREASE**

Preschool fees have recently been reviewed by management committee, and it has been decided to increase fees from 1st April 2022. The last increase of childcare fees was in 2018.

The management committee has worked with the leadership team to review fees for the coming year and have tried to keep fee increases as low as possible; however rising costs such as increased wages costs due to an increase in National living wage, heating, lighting, and other general inflationary costs have necessitated this increase. However, please note our fees continue to be cheaper than most other providers in our local area.

We are making you aware of the forthcoming changes to fees now, in order, for parents/carers to have sufficient time to make the necessary arrangements regarding funding sources such as Universal Credits. The actual childcare fee increase will raise from £5 to £6 per hour from 1 April 2022. We shall be writing to all parent carers in the next few weeks.



- We continue to not accept bags or toys from home in preschool, please use paper bags to support our COVID saftey measures and our drive to reduce the use of plastics.
- Please can parents take extra care when using our car park and be extra vigilant, especially during these darker evenings. At busy times there are children and parents constantly moving through the car park, and we want to ensure everyone is safe.
- Please ensure your child's clothes are labelled, including coats and shoes.
- Please make sure your child has appropriate clothing for outside play whatever the season. In particular, coats, gloves, hats and appropriate footwear for being outside.
- Please remember to bring in nappies and wipes. Unfortunately we will need to charge (£1) for the preschool nappies and wipes.

Don't forget our referral reward, it's our way of saying thank you to those parents who recommend family, friends and colleagues to Watoto PreSchool. The reward will be £75 as long as the following criteria is met –

Your name is mentioned at the time or enquiry/booking The new child's booking is a minimum of three sessions per week on a full time (48 weeks a year) contract.

Once the new child has attended Watoto Preschool for 3 full months the £75 reward will be issued in the 4th month

This reward is only applicable when fee-paying children are introduced to Watoto Pre-School, unfortunately we cannot extend this offer to children exclusively accessing the governments free early learning entitlement
