

2024 Fee Increase

The management committee has worked with the leadership team to review fees for the coming year and have tried to keep fee increases as low as possible; however rising costs such as increased wages costs due to the increase in National living wage, heating, lighting, and other general inflationary costs have necessitated this increase. However, our fees continue to be cheaper than most other providers in our local area.

The fees for childcare places per hour will increase from £6.50 to £7 per hour for parent/carers, for organisations paying for a child's childcare the increase will be £7.50 per hour.

Increases for snack, lunch etc will come into effect on the 1st April 2024.

A letter with more details will be issued before the end of term.

This term's Core Books

We believe an important part of learning to read is to develop a love of books. Through sharing books, children develop a range of skills and become confidence readers.

In our preschool we have chosen a selection of books which we call out Core Books. Each book has been chosen because of the special qualities it has. Most are repetitive, allowing young children to quickly join in and retell the story in the absence of an adult. Repetition is really important so we ensure we regularly read these stories to the children, and they are always available for them to access in our book corner. We also link a variety of opportunities and activities to the chosen book.

Benefits of Preschool

Of course, every child is different and attending preschool is a transition, but the benefits will have some positive effects on your little one.

At Watoto Preschool your child will benefit from:

Socialising

Social interaction with other children of a similar age, including:

- Making friends and learning to establish connections
- Learning to share
- Taking turns
- · Listening to others
- Playing together with others in groups, as well as independently
- Learning from their peers, copying and helping each other



Developing Communication Skills

Being more socialised and interacting with their peers and preschool practitioners, your child will also develop their communication skills, increase their vocabulary and language through a wide range of different contexts.

Learning how to communicate their feelings and opinions and interacting with their peers and adults other than their parent/carers is a vital part of their development. Playing with other children at preschool is a useful way to ease your child's transition to starting school. Starting school will not come as a shock to a child that is already used to spending time in a learning environment, and it provides an idea opportunity for them to gain a greater understanding of other people's feelings and empathy.

Increased Independence and Confidence

Preschool may be the first time your child has been away from you for a short period of time, which can be daunting for you both at first. However, it gives your child the opportunity to be independent, have freedom to explore and to make other relationships, which is critical for their long-term wellbeing.

That added independence can nurture your child's self-confidence, help to develop their own personality, disposition, thoughts and ideas, and encourage them as they discover more about life outside of their family unit.



Benefits of Preschool

Learning New Skills

Starting preschool will be an exciting new adventure for young children and they will nurture a wide range of new skills. From learning to hold a pencil correctly through to developing their emerging numeracy skills, your little one will be rapidly expanding their skill set at preschool.

Having so many different things for your child to discover and explore helps to develop their interests and encourages them to try new things out for themselves. It's an exciting new adventure and the bonus is, you can leave the messy play to preschool.

Routine and Structure

The benefits of routines in the lives of young children is a subject often spoken about as a way of establishing a feeling of security for little ones. Attending preschool provides children with some routine, structure and flexibility and choice in their day. This strong foundation enables children to play a more active role in tasks as they know what to do and when to do it. For example, they will know that before home time they need to tidy up, before lunch time they need to help set the table and wash their hands.

At preschool, your child will be participating in activities, constantly learning new things and exploring the outside space. By keeping children busily engages in play opportunities, it helps to build their physical stamina and supports large motor skills development, which will certainly be needed for school and beyond!

Building Immunity

Interaction at preschool with other children and adults support developing their immunity to common infections such as colds. Being outdoors in the fresh air and getting daily exercise is good for all round wellbeing and will help keep your little one fit and healthy.

Become 'School Ready'

Attending preschool will help ease your child's transition to starting school. Starting school will not come as such a shock to a child that is already used to spending time in a learning environment.

Preparing to be Life-Long Learners

Many of the benefits above help to build the foundations of your child's future. Preschool encourages critical thinking, positive dispositions to learn, tenacity and confidence. Preschool prepares children for the outside world and their journey into adulthood.

Reminders

Changing Weather

 Can parents make sure that their child comes in warm clothing. Please bring them in a warm coat with a hood. They will also need a woolly hat, gloves, mittens, a scarf and wellies as it gets colder and wetter. The wellies need to be labelled and will be left at preschool until the end of the school year.

Arrivals and Departures and Security

- Your child's safety and happiness are of the utmost importance to us. Please encourage your child to hold your hand when walking to and from preschool. We do our best to teach children road safety and appreciate your support. In a few weeks' time, we will be talking to the children about what we do in the event of a fire at Watoto Preschool and will be carrying out fire drills when the children have settled in. Please note that the staff at Watoto Preschool are responsible for your child when they have been brought inside the building and been noted on our register. You resume responsibility when you collect your child.
- To strengthen our security procedure, we require a password for people collecting your child other than yourself or your regular collector e.g., childminder. The password will be agreed by us and you when you inform us someone other than yourself is collecting your child from preschool. Parent / carers must inform them of your password as for safeguarding reasons we can't let children go home with somebody unknown to us.

Any Changes??

If you have moved house, changed your telephone number or your emergency contact person, please let us know by emailing or writing down the new details.

Should your child start taking medication for asthma, develop an allergy or anything else please keep us informed.



Illnesses

If your child has a high temperature, please keep them at home until they are better. Please also don't send your child into preschool if they have a really snotty cold. Pre-schoolers are generally unable to blow or wipe their own noses and therefore spread germs very quickly to other children and staff which can cause issues with adequately staffing each session.

If your child has a stomach upset remember to keep them at home for 48 hours after a period of sickness and/or diarrhoea.

Absences/Holidays

If your child will not be coming to Watoto Preschool because they are ill, please ring or text us between 8.00 -9.00am (if possible) and keep us informed when they are likely to return.

For longer absences e.g., family holidays please provide a letter detailing dates and reasons for the absence as our funding is based on children attending regularly, although preschool is not like school so a week's holiday in term time is not seen as an unauthorised absence.
